

CWCI Case Law Seminar XXVII – 2025 Update

Background: The California workers' compensation system is being constantly reshaped and redefined by case law. The growing volume of appellate case law and WCAB panel decisions, combined with the increased complexity of the issues, has made it difficult for workers' compensation professionals to keep up with all the changes and devise appropriate strategies, defenses, and responses. The 2025 program represents the 27th installment in the CWCI case law seminar series, and is designed for attorneys, claims personnel, hearing reps, and others who are responsible for administering and defending workers' compensation claims.
